



HELP PREVENT DISTRACTED WALKING

TO ENTER Students in grades 1–6 must create a poster or collage on 8.5 x 11inch paper showing how they can help prevent distracted walking. A parent or teacher can submit student entries.

Entries will be judged on the following criteria: 1) Originality and creativity (30 points); 2) Concept (30 points); 3) Clarity of message (30 points); and 4) Quality of writing (10 points)

Open to students in grades 1–6. Only individual entries will be accepted—no group posters or collages. No videos, CDs, or digital submissions. Teachers may mail entries in one envelope for the whole class.

DeFEET DISTRACTIONS NEW YORK CONTEST RULES

Official Contest Rules

No Purchase Necessary. Void where prohibited. The DeFEET DISTRACTIONS NEW YORK Poster Contest ("Contest") starts on February 12, 2018 and closes on May 15, 2018, at which time all entries must be received.

How to Enter: The contest is open to individual students in Grades 1 – 6 attending schools in New York State with PTA Units that are members in good standing of the New York State PTA ("NYS PTA"). Entrants must submit a poster that presents a message warning of the dangers of distracted walking. Entries may be submitted only by a representative of the school's PTA. Multiple entries from each PTA Unit may be submitted in one package; however each individual entry must have full contact information and parental signature on an official entry form.

Entrants may download an official entry form from <https://nyspta.org/home/programs/everychild-travelssafely>. A lesson plan and related information about distracted walking is available at the same site.

Completed entry forms must be mailed by the deadline date to: DeFEET DISTRACTIONS NEW YORK Poster Contest, c/o New York State PTA, One Wembley Court, Albany, NY 12205. All entries must include a poster (no larger than 8-1/2" x 11"), PTA Unit representative's name, address, phone and email contact information, as well as name and address of the PTA Unit's school. Each entry must include the name and grade of the student and have the student's parent signature. Entries must be submitted by mail only (not by email).

Each entry must be in keeping with the image of The National Road Safety Foundation ("NRSF") and the PTA and may not be offensive or

inappropriate, as determined by NRSF and NYS PTA in their sole discretion. An entry may not defame or invade publicity rights or the privacy rights of any person living or deceased or otherwise infringe on any person's personal or property rights or any third-party rights. NRSF reserves the right to disqualify any entry it deems to be offensive, inappropriate or not in keeping with the image of NRSF or PTA, in their sole discretion.

Eligibility: The contest is open only to individual students currently in Grades 1 – 6 and attending a school in the state of New York that has an active NYS PTA Unit. Entrants must be legal residents of the United States. Employees of NRSF and the New York State PTA and members of their families living in the same household, their parents, subsidiaries, affiliates, and their advertising, promotion or production agencies are not eligible to enter.

All personal information collected from entrants, parents/guardians and teachers will be retained in accordance with NRSF's records retention policies for the Contest. All entries will be kept for one year following the selection of winners. All winning entries will be kept for up to three years. By submitting an entry, the entrant understands and consents to the collection and maintenance of his or her information and acknowledges and agrees that such information may be available to United States authorities or otherwise accessed in accordance with U.S. federal or applicable state law.

Entries will be provided to both NRSF and NYS PTA and will be subject to the privacy policy of NRSF and subject to review by NYS PTA. NRSF privacy policy may be found at www.nrsf.org/terms.

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NRSF and NYS PTA are not responsible for late, lost, stolen, inaccurate, garbled, damaged, illegible, undelivered, delayed, misdirected or postage-due entries or for any computer, network, technical, typographical, human or other error, problem or malfunction related to or in connection with the Contest.

Entries: By submitting an entry, each entrant agrees that NRSF shall own the entry submitted (including all rights embodied therein in winning entries) and any derivative works made therefrom and that it and its designees may exploit, edit, publish, use, adapt, modify or dispose of any entry and elements embodied therein online, in print, film, television or in any other media for advertising, promotional or other purposes throughout the world in perpetuity, without additional compensation or notification, or permission of the entrant, except as prohibited by law.

Judging Criteria: Entries will be judged on the following criteria:

Concept originality and creativity: (35 points)

Execution: Is the poster clean and easy to read?
Spelling counts. (35 points)

Clarity of message (30 points)

Prizes: One Grand Prize of \$1,500 will be awarded to the winning PTA Unit. Three runners-up will each receive \$500 for their schools' PTA Units.

All prizes are funded and awarded by NRSF.

Selection of Winners: Entries submitted will be judged by NRSF and NYS PTA. The winner and runners-up will be notified on or around May 31, 2018. Each entrant agrees to be bound by the Official Rules and the decisions of the judges are final in all matters relating to this Contest.

By entering and/or accepting a prize, each entrant and/or winner hereby releases and holds harmless NRSF and NYS PTA, their respective

affiliates, subsidiaries, advertising and promotion agencies, and all others associated with the development and execution of this Contest (including prize suppliers), and the respective officers, directors, shareholders, agents, and employees of the foregoing from any and all claims, demands, losses, promises, causes of action, and liabilities arising out of the preparation for or participation in this Contest, or any use or misuse of any prize (or any portion thereof) awarded hereunder, including any travel or activity related thereto.

This prize is contingent upon the Grand Prize winner providing reasonable assistance to NRSF in terms of any necessary information to include in news releases and other press material.

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the participation of any participant whose conduct potentially compromises the Contest, and is at its sole discretion to award the prizes from among all eligible non-suspect entries received prior to termination using the judging procedures outlined above.

Lesson Plan - Teacher Instructions

Grade level: 1 - 3

Objective: To observe surroundings and avoid distracted walking.

Standard based skills: Discuss, examine and draw images.

Materials: Paper, crayons, colored pencils and “Take the Pledge” and the “DeFEET” handouts.

Introduction: Start a discussion about things that are distracting while walking. Behavior when boarding and exiting a school bus and how to safely play outdoors.

Engage: Ask students to demonstrate behaviors while walking, playing or getting in and out of school bus/vehicles.

Ask students to write words that supports good behavior and bad behavior. Other students can draw good behavior and careless behavior while walking.

Place all images on the board and have students select what are good behaviors and irresponsible behaviors.

Using handout: Give students a copy of the “Take the Pledge” sheet and the “DeFEET Distractions Infographic.” Discuss with students and have them take home and discuss with family and friends.

Grade level: 4 - 6

Objectives: Identify safe and distracted walking actions, the risks, and reflect on personal behaviors.

Standard based skills: Breakout into groups to discuss and write down different types of distracted walking. Share details in a collaborative discussion.

Materials: Paper, pens, Student activity sheet, “Take the Pledge” and the “DeFEET Distractions Infographic.”

Introduction: Ask students where they walk, and discuss responsibilities of a pedestrian.

Engage: Distribute copies of the activity sheet and brainstorm safe tips to help avoid and prevent distracted walking.

Encourage students to come up with preventive tips that can be shared with the class, family and friends.

Using handout: Ask students to use the chart to observe their walking behaviors for three days. Give students copies of the “Take the Pledge” sheet and the “DeFEET Distractions Infographic.” Discuss with student and have them to take home and discuss with family and friends.

Take the Pledge

At some point everyone is a pedestrian. As parents and caretakers, we want to keep our children safe at all times. Talk to your children about the dangers of distracted walking and share these simple guidelines to ensure their safety.

- I will keep my head up, eyes and ears open at all times
- I will not use devices or headphones while walking or riding my bike
- I will cross at the crosswalk and not in between cars
- I promise not to talk to others while crossing the street
- I promise to ride my bike in the same direction as traffic
- I promise to look left-right-left when exiting the school bus
- I promise not to dart out in traffic
- I will encourage my friends and family to do the same

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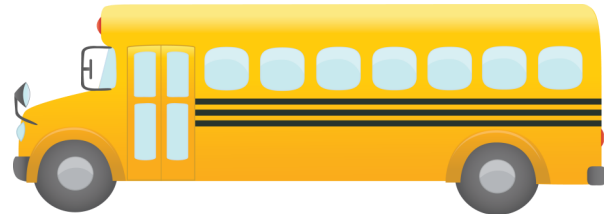

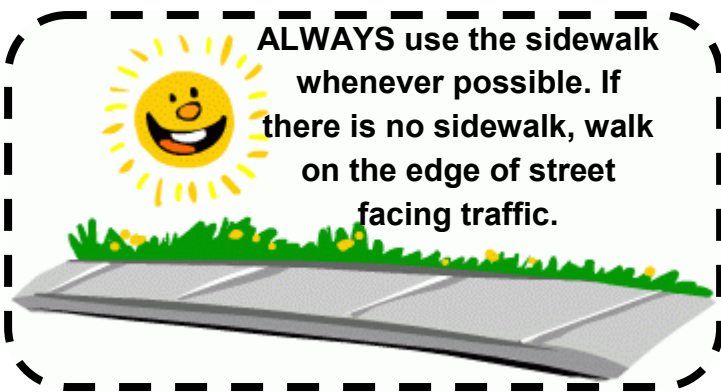
Pedestrians killed in traffic crashes

Stay 5 steps away from the curb

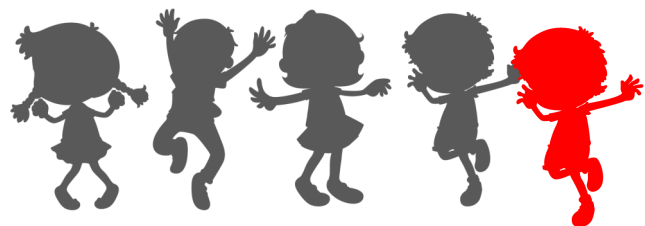


ALWAYS obey traffic signs
