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NEW CLASSROOM CONTEST EDUCATES STUDENTS ON THE DANGERS OF DISTRACTED WALKING

The National Road Safety Foundation Launches DeFEET Distractions – A New Classroom Program about the Dangers of Distracted Walking, Featuring a Poster Contest for Students in Grades K–5 and Classroom Resources for Educators

The contest invites students, working with their teachers and/or parents, to develop a visual message – a poster or collage – that speaks to their peers and pedestrians of all ages about safe, distraction-free walking.
